



ARDEN-ARCADE



Sprawling out along much of Sacramento's east side, Arden-Arcade is an expansive neighborhood that falls between the American River and Interstate 80 from Arden Fair to Carmichael. Residents of this area enjoy convenient access to downtown Sacramento for commuting ease, as well as the ample outdoor recreation opportunities afforded by the miles of trails and greenspace along the American River at the neighborhood's southern edge.

Homebuyers looking to choose from a wide selection of single-family homes, townhomes, and condominiums in a peacefully residential part of Sacramento are sure to find a multitude of options in Arden-Arcade. Homes in this area are part of he San Juan Unified School District, which has highly rated schools from elementary through high school.

CARMICHAEL



Carmichael is a classic suburban community, comprised of well-kept ranch-style and contemporary homes positioned along tree-lined streets with pockets of private gated communities and posh estates along the American River. The homes have close proximity to the American River Parkway. In this neighborhood, you can easily walk your dog or jog on a variety of walking trails. For the more adventurous, ride your bike on the 32-mile Jedediah Smith memorial bike trail and enjoy road, gravel and mountain bike riding. There are plenty of beaches to have a picnic or take a dip in the American River. Fish, kayak, stand-up paddleboard (sup) or float down the river on a raft. There are more than a dozen parks nestled throughout Carmichael. The community's crowning jewel is Ancil Hoffman park, located on the American River Parkway. The 395-acre park features the Effie Yeaw nature center and an 18-hole golf course. The 38-acre Carmichael park is also popular among locals and Sacramentans everywhere. It has five baseball fields, six tennis courts, three playgrounds, an off-leash dog park, a frisbee golf course, and a clubhouse.

CURTIS PARK



Curtis Park is known for its craftsman, Spanish revival, storybook architecture, Tudor style homes, historic character and suburban feel. The 24th Street Theatre, built in 1929, hosts plays, concerts, and comedy performances. The neighborhood's namesake park has a jogging trail, tennis courts, and summer concerts. Several casual bistros, craft breweries, and tap houses can be found throughout the area. Gunther's Ice Cream has been a local favorite since 1940 and Marie's Doughnuts is a nostalgic destination for residents all over the city. Nearby Taylor's Market is an excellent gourmet grocery. This is one neighborhood that does not lack amenities. Leonardo da Vinci elementary in neighboring Hollywood Park is often a popular school with local families.

DOWNTOWN



The downtown area is the heart of Sacramento, offering everything from incredible farm-to-table eateries and specialty boutiques to historic homes and the California State Capitol. Restaurant offerings include everything from the James Beard Award-winning Frank Fat's, a traditional family-owned Chinese-American eatery where political and business leaders meet, to the more modern Ella Dining Room and Bar, which boasts a seasonal French-influenced menu. This region boasts the new Downtown Commons (DOCO), a two level mixed-use entertainment and shopping complex that contains the Golden 1 Center, the home of the Sacramento Kings. Near upscale hotels and an IMAX theater, the SAFE Credit Union Convention and Performing Arts District contains a renovated convention and performing arts center. Downtown is the bustling metropolitan hub of the region. On the western side of downtown is the Old Sacramento Waterfront with historic buildings, wood-plank sidewalks, museums, and the Sacramento River. The California State Railroad Museum draws tourists and school groups alike with its impressive collection of historical exhibits. The nearby Crocker Art Museum and California Automobile Museum provide visitors with hours of uniquely Californian cultural interest and history.

EAST SACRAMENTO



East Sacramento is known for its tree-lined streets and parks, such as McKinley and East Portal Parks. The area has a lively dining scene, with everything from casual burger joints to refined farm-to-fork restaurants, plus family-friendly craft breweries and artisan coffee shops. The nationally-renowned Corti Brothers, an Italian specialty grocery store, has been a neighborhood staple since 1947. Any foodie or gourmet cook would enjoy the amenities local to this neighborhood. East Sacramento also features the city's most fashionable Fabulous 40's neighborhood that architecture enthusiasts will adore, but its main draw is its relaxed family-friendly atmosphere. Many families bicycle the neighborhood, which is known for its impressive holiday light displays and festive Fourth of July parade. East Sacramento homes are some of the most varied in the region, with European revivals, bungalows, craftsman, Spanish, Tudors, and ranch style homes, which range from quaint storybook to grand estate in style.

East Sacramento's quaint shops and eateries, established private schools, parks, and small-town vibe make it a great place for young families. This neighborhood has some of the city's most highly rated elementary schools, with Phoebe Hearst, Theodore Judah, and David Lubin all within close proximity.

EL DORADO HILLS

GREENHAVEN AND POCKET



Natomas is a true suburb and as such, usually requires driving to find the best restaurants. But favorites such as Bonchon Natomas, Jack's Urban Eats and Daikon Korean BBQ are worth the drive.

If you're the outdoorsy type, Discovery Park, one of the region's largest green spaces, is the perfect place to perch during a hot Sacramento summer day. A part of the American River Parkway, the park offers a variety of recreational activities including boating, picnic areas and wading in the river.

In the summer, the 47+ acre North Natomas Regional Park hosts some of the community's biggest events, including movie nights and farmers markets. The park also offers its own sports fields, bikeways, play areas, water features, and some of the best play areas for both kids and dogs. In the winter, some of the region's most impressive holiday lights displays can be found in Natomas.

OAK PARK



Oak Park is Sacramento's first suburb and one of its most historically significant neighborhoods. With close and easy access to Midtown and Downtown, it offers convenient proximity to major destinations across the city. TAHOE PARK





WEST SACRAMENTO




Often confusing to new visitors, west Sacramento is its own city, separate from Sacramento, across Interstate 5 and the Sacramento River. West Sacramento is home to Sutter Health Park, home of the Sacramento river cats, the AAA affiliate of the San Francisco giants. West Sacramento is a growing area and even has areas with new construction, a rarity in the region.

Just blocks back from the waterfront is a burgeoning cluster of restaurants and bars, and several breweries, such as jackrabbit and bike dog, are just down the river. Retail giants like Ikea anchor shopping centers just off interstate 80 that have many food options and other shopping choices.


